"The British section was formed in Bristol in 1968. According to the late Don Hatwell, a former secretary, he was recruited by the first secretary, Alastair Stuart of Thomson Regional, who 'fixed our lunches at the Caledonian Club and introduced me to the malt which changed my life: The Macallan'. He complained in his memoirs that, with notable exceptions, the AEJ always had too few women, that he could never understand how the Italians never had fewer than three sections, and how impressed he was at one congress when the Portuguese were represented by one Jose Manuel Barroso, who later became president of the Commission."
